#### Part 1: Committee purpose and duties

The Regional Economy Committee (the "Committee") was created by the board of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) to guide and support the agency's initiatives related to the regional economy, the agency's strategic direction, and implementation of the comprehensive regional plan, the ON TO 2050 plan.

The Regional Economy Committee shall:

- A. Serve as a standing committee of the CMAP Board.
- B. Bring a broad, regional perspective to the agency's economy-related initiatives and expand the agency's expertise on specific economic issues and geographies.
- C. Serve as a resource on economic issues to CMAP staff, the Transportation Committee, the Climate Committee, and other advisory groups.
- D. Review and provide input to the agency on its strategic direction, workplan, and economyrelated projects.
- E. Coordinate and prioritize the agency's economy-related work with other regional initiatives and partners.
- F. Broaden regional awareness of and support for the agency's economy-related initiatives.
- G. Support implementation of the agency's strategic direction and the long-range transportation plan for, including but not limited to:
  - 1. Inclusive regional growth; and
  - 2. Increasing access to economic opportunity.
- H. Review recommendations of the agency's economy-related advisory groups and advance those recommendations, as appropriate, for consideration by the CMAP Board.
- I. Assist CMAP staff in evaluating and tracking performance measures on the agency's economy-related initiatives.
- J. Annually report its activities, goals, and objectives to the CMAP Board.
- K. Align its work with CMAP's core values: serve with passion, pursue equity, foster collaboration, lead with excellence, and drive innovation.

#### Section 2: Committee membership

- A. **Appointment**: In accordance with the By-Laws of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning, the executive director is delegated authority to appoint individuals to the Regional Economy Committee.
- B. **Members**: The Committee shall consist of 20 to 25 regional members who serve without compensation. Members shall represent the region's geographic and demographic diversity <u>and</u> have experience in a broad range of economy-related issues. Committee members must be residents of the CMAP region.
- C. **Terms**: Each member will be appointed for one 3-year term with the option for a second 3year term, by mutual agreement. No member may serve for more than two consecutive terms. After expiration of a Committee member's term, they shall serve until their successor is appointed.
- D. **Attendance**: Committee members are expected to attend each meeting. If a Committee member fails to attend three consecutive regular meetings without reasonable cause, or otherwise neglects their duties as a Committee member, the executive director may declare the seat vacant and appoint a new member.
- E. **Chair and vice chair**: Each year, the executive director designates a chair and a vice-chair from the Committee's members at its first meeting of each calendar year. The chair and vice chair may not serve for more than two 1-year terms. The Committee chair shall preside over the meetings; the vice chair will preside in the chair's absence. The chair and vice chair are voting members of the Committee.
- F. The Committee membership may include three members *ex officio* who may participate in discussion and deliberation of the Committee, but who shall have the right to vote only if their attendance secures a quorum for the Committee or to break a voting tie.

#### Section 3: Committee meetings

- A. The Committee will shall meet at least quarterly and approve its meeting schedule at its first meeting of each calendar year.
- B. Special meetings may be called by the executive director as needed.
- C. Meetings shall be open and accessible to the public in accordance with the Illinois Open Meetings Act, 5 ILCS 120/7 *et seq*.
- D. Members may attend the Committee's public meetings by video or audio conference only as permitted by the Open Meetings Act.
- E. A Committee member shall notify the Committee staff liaison or chair in advance and in writing (email preferred) of their request to attend by video or audio conference, unless advance notice is impractical.
- F. A majority of the members of the Committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
- G. At any meeting at which a quorum is present, an affirmative vote of a majority of members shall carry an issue.

H. Unless inconsistent with these By-laws or otherwise decided by the CMAP Board, meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

#### Section 4: Miscellaneous

- A. The business of the Committee is conducted in accordance with the Illinois Regional Planning Act and the Illinois Open Meetings Act.
- B. The Committee will be supported by CMAP staff members for administrative functions.
- C. The Committee may adopt rules necessary to exercise its purpose and duties.
- D. In the event of a conflict between these By-Laws and the By-Laws of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning, the latter will prevail.

Purpose:	Staff will lead the committee in a discussion of CMAP's approaches to the objectives of the regional economy focus area using the IF/AND/THEN statements. Committee members will discuss the approaches and potential performance measurements.

Action Requested: Discussion

As CMAP undertakes a strategic planning effort, the Regional Economy Committee can play a unique role in this process. The Committee shall contribute to the agency's mission and support the implementation of the agency's strategic direction and the long-range transportation plan by providing feedback on the approaches the agency has outlined to achieve its strategic goals.

Through the strategic planning process to date, CMAP has identified three goals that align with the agency's focus areas of transportation, climate, and regional economy. Contributing to the goal are multiple objectives, which are long-term changes that CMAP expects its activities to advance but are not solely responsible for achieving. Each objective is advanced by several outcomes, which is the highest level at which CMAP believes observed changes are the results of its activities.

This memo provides the approaches that CMAP has developed, by identifying "IF" and "AND" statements representing the results of CMAP activities, "THEN" statements representing the outcomes, and related work plan activities that contribute to each approach.

After a presentation by staff the Committee will discuss and provide feedback on the approaches to the goal for the regional economy focus area being, **a robust and inclusive regional economy**. The discussion will be framed around the following questions:

• How accurately do the "IF" and "AND" statements explain how CMAP will achieve the "THEN" statement? (Accurately / Somewhat Accurately / Not Accurately)

- If not or somewhat accurately, what do you suggest to make the statement more accurate?
- What performance measures should CMAP be tracking to validate progress towards achieving the "THEN" statement?

We will most likely not get to all the approaches during the time allotted therefore, a link will be sent to committee members to submit feedback for all approaches after the meeting. CMAP will use the feedback received to further refine the agency's approach to the regional economy focus area goal.

### Regional economy focus area goal: A robust and inclusive regional economy

#### **OBJECTIVE ONE: Increased inclusive growth**

#### Approach (Outcome) One:

#### IF

We develop and support the implementation of an inclusive regional economic growth strategy with performance measures

#### AND

We establish a consistent and structured Regional Economic Collaborative **THEN** 

Inclusive economic strategies will be coordinated and implemented

#### Approach (Outcome) Two:

#### IF

We develop and support the implementation of strategies for targeting investments in freightreliant industries and planning for compulsory transportation infrastructure

#### AND

We increase implementer awareness and support the use of planning resources and coordinated solutions for mitigating the community impacts of new and existing freight-reliant industries **THEN** 

Investment in freight-reliant traded industry clusters will grow and impacts on communities will be mitigated

#### **Approach (Outcome) Three:**

#### IF

We develop and support the implementation of strategies for communities to increase their mix of housing options connected to transportation networks

#### AND

We increase implementer awareness of the benefits of improving the diversity and connectedness of the region's housing stock

#### THEN

There will be greater diversity in housing choices that have access to jobs and economic opportunity

#### **OBJECTIVE TWO: Increased access to economic opportunities**

#### Approach (Outcome) One:

#### IF

We incorporate evidence-based tools into CMAP transportation investment decision-making to support and foster investment in communities affected by disinvestment, and support state and local governments in doing the same

#### AND

We support communities affected by disinvestment with planning resources and implementation activities to plan, fund, and maintain transportation infrastructure **THEN** 

Areas of disinvestment will have increased access to CMAP transportation programming resources

#### Approach (Outcome) Two:

#### IF

We identify structural barriers to economic opportunity and propose and support solutions **AND** 

We increase implementer awareness and support an increased focus on reducing structural barriers for communities affected by disinvestment

#### THEN

Communities affected by disinvestment will have greater access and the tools to maximize economic opportunities
